

Bunker Hills Senior Men's League Quick Reference Rules Sheet

<u>Common Rules Situation</u>	<u>Option</u>
Out of Bounds	D J
Lost Ball	D J
Unplayable Ball	D E G
In Water Penalty Area (Yellow Stakes)	C D H
In Lateral Penalty Area	C D F H
Original or Replacement Ball played from penalty area comes to rest in the same or another penalty area (4 th shot from options D, F, H)	C D F H
Hitting the wrong ball	A B
Grounding the ball in bunker	A B
Giving or asking advice	A B
Agreeing to waive rules	A B
Immovable obstruction interferes with swing or stance	C I
Ball in Ground Under Repair	C I
Unplayable ball in bunker	D K L M
General Penalty in Stroke Play	N

<u>Option</u>	<u>Procedures & Penalties</u>
A.	Two strokes in medal (stroke) play
B.	Loss of hole in Match Play
C.	Play the ball as it lies – no penalty
D.	One stroke – replay the ball from where the last ball was hit (this is known as stroke and distance.
E.	One stroke – drop the ball within two club lengths of where the ball lies. *
F.	One stroke – The reference point for taking lateral relief is the estimated point where the original ball last crossed the edge of the penalty area. Relief is two club lengths from the reference point, and may be in any area of the course except for the same penalty area. *
G.	One stroke – drop the ball as far back as desired on a line through where the ball last crossed the penalty area and the hole. *
H.	One stroke – drop the ball as far back as desired on a line through the point where the ball last crossed the penalty area. *
I.	Drop within one club length of the nearest point of relief. *
J.	Local Rule: A) Determine where you ball went out of bounds or is likely to be lost. B) Find Spot nearest Fairway Edge. C) Drop ball in relief area.
K	Two stroke - Relief outside the bunker. Back on a line from unplayable ball through the hole Drop ball in a one club relief area *
L	One stroke – May take back-on- line relief but remain in bunker
M	One stroke – take lateral relief from original location. Remain in bunker
N.	Two strokes
*	Drops may never be nearer the hole
